## **SAFETY TIPS FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY SPACE HEATER SAFETY**

- Whatever type of space heater you decide to buy (electric, kerosene, or propane), be sure it is certified and approved by a national testing laboratory such as Underwriters Laboratory and has the UL symbol on it.
- Ensure the model you choose has a "tip switch" that will shut it off if it is knocked over or falls. All models should have this safety feature built into their design.
- A space heater should never be placed closer than three feet to any curtains, bedding, or furniture.
- Never leave a space heater unattended. Turn it off when you leave a room or when you go to sleep.
- Don't allow your children or pets to play too close to a space heater.

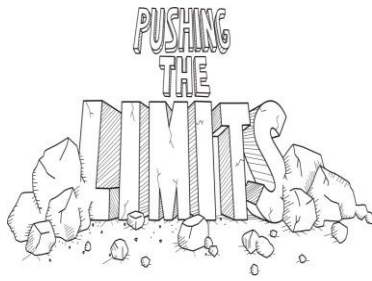

### The first ever free monthly movie and discussion series at the Pembroke Public Library!

The Pembroke Library will host a free four-part series for adults called Pushing the Limits. Stop by for dinner and a movie as we explore Pushing the Limits of Survival, Nature, Connection and Knowledge in everyday life.

Since the beginning of time, humans have imagined and achieved ways to push the boundaries of the physical world. We want to be stronger, smarter, and more aware, and we create stories to bring those dreams to life. But many of those stories are no longer just stories; and with great new advances in science and technology, we are finding ways in which all of us are able to push the limits every day.

The Pushing the Limits program will explore these ideas in discussions that will include feature films, quality videos and popular books with the theme of Pushing the Limits of Survival, Nature, Connection and Knowledge. The overarching theme is one of real people, real stories and real science.

The programs will be held at 6:00 pm on the fourth Friday of the month starting January 27 with Pushing the Limits of Survival and will include a movie, a light supper, door prizes and friendly discussion with members of the community:

**Jan. 27th @ 6:00 pm - THE ENDURANCE (2000)** - Winner of 8 major awards and many more nominations, narrated by Liam Neeson. A documentary retelling of Sir Ernest Shackleton's ill-fated tall ship expedition to Antarctica in 1914-1916, featuring new footage of the actual locations and interviews with surviving relatives of key expedition members, plus archived audio interviews with expedition members.

Book recommendation - Arctic Drift by Clive Cussler - copies of the book are available at the library - just ask at the desk.

Film historian and local movie reviewer, Jim Reed will lead the discussion on the monthly theme, introduce the movie and suggest further exploration through themed novels. Jim is familiar to many for his weekly film reviews in the Savannah Morning News DoSavannah as well as his Psychotronic Film Society's screenings around Savannah.

The Pembroke Library is one of 100 rural public libraries nationwide receiving funding from the National Science Foundation to host the series.
