### 'Stay Cool in the City Pool!'



“Stay Cool in the Pool” this summer at the J. Dixie Harn Community Center! Beginning May 30<sup>th</sup>, the pool will be open every day, except Tuesdays, between the hours of 1:00PM and 6:00PM until September 2<sup>nd</sup>. Admission is only \$3.00 per day! Trained lifeguards are present during pool hours to ensure swimmers' safety. The Recreation Department will also offer water aerobics and swim lessons on Monday, Wednesday and Friday each week! Water aerobics will be held from 10:00 until 11:00AM for \$3.00 each session. Swim lessons will be available from 11:00AM to 12:00PM for \$5.00 per lesson. Of course, concessions will be available every day!
